


# City of Los Angeles: Number of Households Receiving Housing Choice Vouchers






### Los Angeles County: Rapid Re-Housing Placements by Census Tract




### Map 11 – Disadvantaged Communities and Low-Income Communities Investments











This map and list show the rates from Feb. 20, 2017 to Aug. 20, 2017, the most recent six months for which complete data is available for all areas patrolled by the departments.




City of Los Angeles: Annual Violent Crimes per 1000 People by Census Tract (5 Year Average)




City of Los Angeles: Annual Property Crimes per 1000 People by Census Tract (5 Year Average)



The City of Los Angeles inspects al properties containing two or more units, regardless of when they were built, to ensure that these units are in compliance with building codes and standards. Each property receives a Reliable Information to Score Effectively (RISE) score that is based on inspection data from each cycle. A RISE Score is considered low when a property scores a six or below (1-6). Properties start with a base score of ten, where points are deducted according to the scale below. In Cycle III, a total of 4.034 properties received a RISE Score of 6 or below:

1. Case takes over 120 days for compliance -1 2. Number of violations is over 5 per unit -1 3. Case is referred to enforcement -1 4. Property had more than 3 valid compliants -1 5. Case required a GM Hearing -1












City of Los Angeles: At Risk Affordable Housing Units with Low Poverty Index


















City of L.A. AFH: Percent of Total Loans that were Originated by Census Tract, 2016



City of L.A. AFH: Percent of Total Loans that were Denied by Census Tract, 2016













